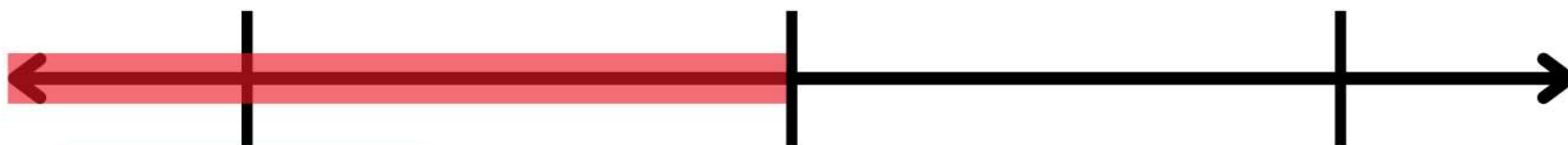


Simple Past Tense Verbs

closed

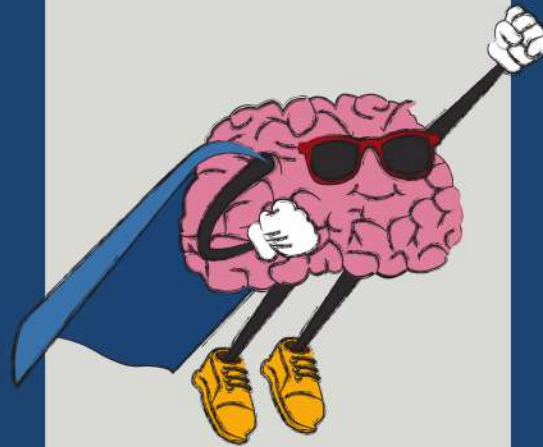
Phonics
